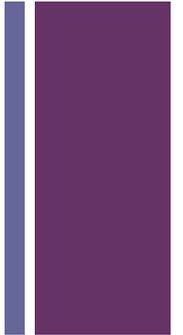


+ Female Candidates



- Since 1872, 14 women have run for President
- 63 countries have had women in the highest position
- Hold position elsewhere, but not President (except on TV)-
People are more comfortable with women in VP position

+ Rhetoric Towards Female Candidates

- Struggle, optimism, careful public discourse, and gender implications (Gutgold)
- Question based on health, wellness
- “Commander in Chief” rhetoric
- Partisan activities vs. sexism

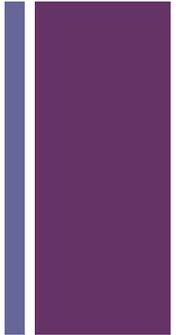


Presidential Candidate

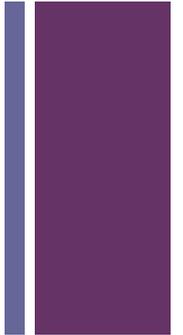
+ Trump's Tirades



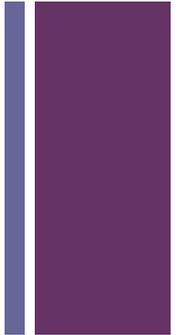
- Examples of Trump's antics, quotes
